

Earthplace Preschool COVID-19 Action Plan

| Symptoms | Direct Exposure (i.e. Classroom Exposure) | Positive for COVID-19 | Travel | Household Exposure |

| <p>Any child who experiences symptoms that are attributed to COVID-19 must visit their healthcare provider.</p> <p>A clearance note is required from the healthcare provider that includes the diagnosis and return date.</p> | <p>No quarantine needed unless the contact is a household member. In this case, quarantine for a minimum of 5 days from the last date of exposure.</p> <p>Monitor for symptoms. If symptoms develop, the child must visit their healthcare provider and follow instructions for symptoms.</p> <p>If no symptoms, test on days 1, 3, and 5 (antigen/rapid test, or PCR test.) Submit a photo of at-home test results together with the Earthplace Preschool.</p> <p>For second-hand exposure, no quarantine is required.</p> | <p>The mandatory isolation period after infection will be a minimum of 5 days.</p> <p>In order to return to school, one must be symptom-free.</p> <p>If symptoms persist, remain in isolation until they resolve.</p> <p>Children returning from isolation must wear a mask around others through day 10.</p> <p>If age 2 or under and unable to wear a mask consistently, a child must have two negative antigen tests 48 hours apart in order to return to school.</p> | <p>If possible, delay travel until you are up to date with your COVID-19 vaccines. However, families and individuals must determine their own acceptable level of risk.</p> <p>No quarantine or testing after travel are required.</p> | <p>If a member of your household is infected with COVID-19 please notify Earthplace Preschool and our COVID-19 Response Team will respond with quarantine instructions.</p> |

Mask Policy: As of 03/14/2022, indoor mask-wearing at Earthplace Preschool is optional.

Earthplace Preschool reserves the right to revise these policies as needed in order to ensure the health and safety of all children and staff, and the right to require children who have tested positive or were exposed to maintain quarantine for longer periods of time based on symptoms or other relevant factors that may arise.
